

Atlantic herring Clupea harengus harengus CLUPEIDAE

Size: up to 42 cm

Peculiarities: absence of black spots on the sides; dorsal fin originates about midway of the

body length (1); reduced body depth

Habitat: pelagic fish, travelling in school of hundreds or thousands

Food: zooplankton (small crustaceans, fish eggs, mollusc larvae...)

Enemies: preyed upon by most of the predators (cod, striped bass, mackerel, tuna,

salmon, dogfish, squid, marine mammals, sea birds...)

Relation to man: commercial fish highly in demand. Consumed fresh, frozen or smoked.

Eaten by most of the commercial pelagic fishes.
